Fast Facts

- SMWIA was first organized in 1888 in Toledo, Ohio, and now represents 150,000 skilled craftspersons in the unionized sheet metal industry throughout the United States and Canada.
- SMWIA Local 104 represents approximately 7,000 sheet metal workers.
- SMWIA provides service to 17 Northern California counties: Alameda, Contra Costa, Del Norte, Humboldt, Lake, Marin, Mendocino, Monterey, Napa, San Benito, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Solano, Sonoma and Trinity.

Scope and Range of SMWIA

- SMWIA provides service technicians for commercial, industrial, and residential HVAC needs, creating the HVAC systems that bring clean, conditioned air to homes, public buildings and workplaces.
- SMWIA provides the Testing, Adjusting, and Air Balancing (TAB) specialists for today's closed system buildings.

- In addition to HVAC work, SMWIA craftsmen fabricate and install decking, siding, roofing systems, perform kitchen installations, and create and assemble sheet metal for ships and railroad cars, among other applications.
- Architectural sheet metal workers install stainless steel, brass and copper flashings, columns, skylights, signs and metal ceilings for commercial and residential buildings

An experienced, trained and qualified labor pool

- Through SMWIA training programs, the union has earned the reputation for “doing the job right the first time”.
- SMWIA workers are professionally trained union craftsman with five years of classroom study and on-the-job training before becoming a fully skilled journeyman.
- The 5-year apprenticeship program, with a minimum of 1,200 hours of related classroom instruction, ensures that SMWIA craftsman are skilled in the latest techniques.
- Union training includes the following:
